If you have Blastocystis hominis without signs or symptoms, then you don't need treatment. Mild signs and symptoms might improve on their own within a few days. Potential medications for treating Blastocystis hominis include: Antibiotics, such as metronidazole (Flagyl) or tinidazole (Tindamax)

You can become infected from eating food contaminated with the bacteria, but you cannot become infected through contact with blood.

Blastocystis spp.is the most common parasite found in human stool specimens with prevalence reported to range from 1.5% and 10% in developed countries and from 30% and 50% in developing countries [1,2,13]. The parasite was encountered 28.5 times more than Giardia lamblain a study conducted in the United States in 2000.
