Top Novels for American Literature Classes

In the early decades of the contemporary period, American drama was dominated by three men: Arthur Miller, Tennessee Williams, and Edward Albee. Miller's Death of a Salesman (1949) questioned the American Dream through the destruction of its main character, while Williams's A Streetcar Named Desire (1947) and Cat on a Hot Tin Roof (1955) excavated his characters' dreams and frustrations.
